## Scavenger Hunts – Reading Activity

Scavenger Hunts are a great way to engage your child in independent reading while offering your child a movement opportunity. This can help children stay actively engaged in their reading practice because it is fun! Who doesn't like a good scavenger hunt?

You can create your own Scavenger Hunt on paper, a dry erase board or even a chalkboard. The children like to mark off their list as they find their words, so finding a way they can do that will encourage engagement and completion.

Things to know about the Scavenger Hunts:

- Each Scavenger Hunt should be within a specific classification, for example, things in the kitchen, body parts, bugs, animals, names, etc.
- A great way to find ideas for your Scavenger Hunt is to google your classification. A list of words will pop up for you to choose from.
- The Scavenger Hunt should be at or just a bit above your child's reading abilities:
  - If your child is a phonetic reader, use words that can be phonetically sounded out, varying in length, for example, cat or rabbit, plant or lamp, pumpkin or fig.
  - If your child is reading above phonetic level, you can make your words a bit more advanced, throwing in two letter sound combinations. For example, shelf, shed, car, star, etc. The word should be otherwise phonetic so that two letter sound is easily isolated.
    - Phonograms we focus on first: ai (snail), ar (yarn), ch (chip), ee (feet), er (helicopter), ie (pie), ng (ring), oa (toast), oo (book), or (corn), ou (cloud), oy (boy), qu (quilt), sh (cash), th (moth), ue (blue)
  - o If your child is an avid reader, use any words you can think of, refrigerator, stove, bathroom, tablecloth, cabinet, etc.
